Broad, Germantown, and Erie Transportation Safety Project

The goal of the City of Philadelphia's Broad, Germantown, and Erie Transportation Safety project is to create safe streets that will connect people to the shopping district with intuitive transit and a comfortable pedestrian environment.

The North District Plan was created through a public engagement process and adopted by the Planning Commission in January 2018. The process identified "reestablish Broad and Erie as the "downtown" of the North District" as a focus.

This website includes information about Vision Zero and the efforts underway throughout the City. Vision Zero is a policy that aims to eliminate traffic-related deaths in Philadelphia through road design, education, and traffic safety enforcement. Every year in Philadelphia, residents are subject to approximately 10,000 traffic crashes. These crashes take the lives of around 100 people each year in Philadelphia, and severely injuring 250 more.

This is a tool in our Vision Zero website that has an interactive map highlighting the High Injury Network, the 12% of roads that make up 50% of killed and serious injury crashes in Philadelphia. We built this tool to help the public understand where these crashes have occurred in their community.
